Anyway to get down to the more interesting part. I decided that as Thomas Neil and Agnes Fern were probable Roman Catholic, there might be a record of John's birth in the Archdiocese of Glasgow records. I made an appointment and was told that there was no Catholic church in Gorbals in 1837 so children were baptised at St. Andrew's Cathedral in Clyde Street. I searched all through 1837 and then 1838, no luck so I decided to go back to 1836 and I found him. Details enclosed.

No address unfortunately so I suppose I will just have to plough through the whole 1841 and/or 1851 census until I find them. It is annoying me as much as you now! I hope you are not in to much of a hurry as it will probably take me a long time.

I'm not sure if you are at home just now, I think you said you would be back in mid August but you have probably been and gone by now. Michael has been in California recently and is now in South Africa again.
